

Timi Champion Role Description for Students

The purpose of the Anthem Community Council (ACC)

The Anthem Community Council helps support your school to be as best as it can be. The ACC has four areas which they support the school community with:

- Community including listening to the voices of students, parents/carers, staff and those in the wider community as well as looking at climate change
- Celebration celebrating and sharing of everyone's successes at the school
- **SEND and Inclusion** support students with special education needs and promoting equality and inclusion for everyone
- Panel membership supporting on formal employment, exclusion and complaint review hearings.

Each ACC will have an ACC Chair and in time an ACC Vice-Chair and a team of Champions, including two Timi Champions, appointed by the Headteacher. The ACC meet 4 times a year.

Timi Champion role

The role of the **Timi Champion** is to focus on capturing the student voice and helping to ensure this is heard by everyone across the school and Anthem.

As a Timi Champions you will:

- Impartially listen and give voice to students at your school, based on a termly theme. You can choose how to do this, but some ideas include:
 - Conducting a student survey
 - Holding a student drop in session
- Link in with your school's student council
- Complete the Timi Champion report a week before each ACC meeting to feed back to the ACC on the student voice.
- Discuss what you have put in your Timi Champion report at the ACC meeting, including sharing any ideas you have for improvement.
- Attend the termly online Timi Champion Forums to receive training and support and share ideas with the 32 Timi Champions across all 16 Anthem schools.

Timi Supporters

Your Headteacher will nominate a member of staff as your **Timi Supporter**. The Timi Supporter will help guide you in your role as a Timi Champion. This may include, if you need it:

- Helping you prepare the Timi Champion report
- Helping you to capture and analyse student voice
- Assisting you in communicating your student voice messages at the ACC meeting
- What should the Timi Champions capture and how?
